

Is the applicant a citizen or lawful permanent resident of the United States?

The following documents are legal proof of eligibility:

A clear copy of the applicant's U.S. birth certificate.

Other forms authorized to prove citizenship include:

- Certificate of Citizenship (N560A, N-560AB, N645, N645A or N561)
- Certificate of Naturalization (N550, N570, or N578)
- Certification of Report of Birth; Certification of Birth Abroad (DS-1350 or FS-545)
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad (FS-240) Other forms authorized to prove lawful permanent residency include: - Permanent Resident Alien Card (I-551)
 - Foreign passport stamped by the U.S. Government indicating that the holder has been "Processed for I-551"
- Permanent Resident Re-Entry Permit (I-327)
- Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) with "Temporary I-551" stamp and holder's photograph affixed
- Federated States of Micronesia and the Republic of the Marshall Islands passport accompanied by a Form I-94
- Travel Document issued to Permanent Residents (I-327)
- Travel Document issued to Refugees (I-571)
